CCPS Announces AIR Learning Recovery and Acceleration Program

Program to Focus on Additional Supports for Math, Reading, and Language Arts

JONESBORO- Parents/Guardians, are you ready to help your child soar in their learning?

Clayton County Public Schools (CCPS) is excited to introduce the **Actions Intended for Results (AIR) Learning Recovery and Acceleration Program!** Beginning in October 2023, **AIR** is designed to provide students in grades 3rd through 12th with additional support in Mathematics, Reading, and Language Arts to accelerate unfinished learning.

The sessions will occur on Saturdays, beginning on October 28th for the high school program and November 4th for the elementary and middle school programs. All programs will conclude on March 9th. Please be advised that these learning support sessions are free to students or their families.

How do I register my child for the AIR Learning Recovery and Acceleration Program?

- Registration will open in Infinite Campus on **Monday, September 18, 2023**, and remain open until **Friday, September 29, 2023**.
- Parents/guardians can complete the application through the Infinite Campus Parent Portal. Parents will need a username and password to access their portal account. All pertinent information (physical address, telephone number, email address, etc.) should be up-to-date.
- Parents/guardians may contact the parent liaison at their student's school or Clayton County Public Schools International Center for assistance. Parents/Guardians may refer to the Infinite Campus Overview (https://www.clayton.k12.ga.us/parents/infinite_campus_overview) found on the Clayton County Public Schools website.

What should I do after the registration process is complete?

Students who are accepted into the program will be assigned to various school sites throughout the district. Please be advised that every school **will not** operate the AIR Program Initiative and that the specific AIR Program site for accepted registrants will be provided after registration.

Clayton County Public Schools will also provide transportation for those completing the application process by the application deadline (Friday, September 29, 2023). Breakfast and a snack will be provided as part of the AIR Learning Recovery & Acceleration Program.
