CCPS to Dismiss on Regular Schedule Friday, December 8

All afterschool activities and extra-curricular activities canceled through 12 Noon, Saturday, December 9

As Clayton County Public Schools (CCPS) continues to monitor local weather forecasts, please consider this advisory as an update concerning the district operating hours and scheduled activities. It has been determined that all schools and district offices will dismiss on its regular schedule this afternoon, Friday, December 8. The Campus Kids afterschool program will also dismiss at its regular schedule, however, parents/guardians are encouraged to pick up their children as early as possible.

Due to anticipated winter weather conditions, all afterschool athletic and extra-curricular activities are canceled through 12:00 noon on Saturday, December 9, 2017. This includes the Title I Parent University at Rex Mill Middle School as well as the Orange Duffle Bag Initiative Program at Clayton State University.
