### CCPS Schools and Offices Closed Thursday, January 18, Due to Wintry Weather Road Conditions

**JONESBORO** – Due to anticipated road conditions resulting from below freezing temperatures, Clayton County Public Schools (CCPS) will close all schools and offices Thursday, January 18, 2018. The decision extends to all activities and programs.
