Clayton County Public Schools & Offices to Remain Closed for Spring Break April 6-10, 2020

JONESBORO – Clayton County Public Schools (CCPS) will observe the scheduled 2019-2020 Spring Break beginning Monday, April 6, 2020, through Friday, April 10, 2020. As a result, all schools and offices of Clayton County Public Schools will be closed and all Digital Learning opportunities will be placed on hold until Spring Break has concluded.

During the scheduled closure, Clayton County Public Schools will continue to provide Grab-N-Go meals at the following twenty-two (22) sites: **Elementary Schools**: Church Street, Eddie White Academy, Edmonds, Fountain, Huie, Jackson, King, Lake Ridge, Lee Street, Mount Zion, Pointe South, Tara, and West Clayton. **Middle Schools**: Kendrick, Morrow, North Clayton, and Rex Mill. **High Schools**: Forest Park, Lovejoy, Mount Zion, Mundy's Mill and Riverdale.

Hours to receive meals are 9:00 a.m. until 12:00 p.m. Monday-Friday and children can pick up both breakfast and lunch at the same time. Please note that children must be present to receive meals. These meals are available to all children that are 18 years old and under or over 18 with a state-defined mental or physical disability.

"As we continue to adjust to sheltering in place and social distancing amid the Coronavirus Pandemic, we believe it is important to maintain as much of a regular routine as possible," said Dr. Morcease J. Beasley, Superintendent of Schools. "During Spring Break we expect everyone to, relax and enjoy themselves and remain as safe as possible.
