Clayton County Public Schools to Close in Observance of 2020 Election Day

JONESBORO – All schools and offices of Clayton County Public Schools (CCPS) will be closed Tuesday, November 3, 2020 in observance of the 2020 General Election. Only those employees necessary to facilitate polls on school campuses will be working.

This announcement to close the district on Tuesday, November 3rd has been made to clarify the status of the day on the 2020-2021 calendar for employees. District schools and offices will resume regular COVID-19 operations on Wednesday, November 4, 2020.

The number of polling places across Clayton County has been increased. Forty-five (45) CCPS facilities being used as polling places include **Elementary Schools** (*Anderson, Arnold, Brown, Callaway, Church Street, East Clayton, Fountain, Harper, Hawthorne, Haynie, Huie, Jackson, Kemp, Kilpatrick, King, Lake Ridge, Lee Street, McGarrah, Mt. Zion Primary, Mt. Zion, Oliver, Pointe South, Riverdale, River's Edge, Smith, Suder, Tara and West Clayton*); **Middle Schools** (*Adamson, Babb, Eddie White, Forest Park, Kendrick, Lovejoy, Mundy's Mill, North Clayton, Pointe South, Riverdale and Roberts*); **High Schools** (*Lovejoy, Mt. Zion, Mundy's Mill, North Clayton, and Riverdale*), and Utopian Academy for the Arts.
