CCPS Reminds Stakeholders of Dismissal Plans for End of 2022-2023 School Year

JONESBORO- Clayton County Public Schools acknowledges a correction to the dismissal schedule announced earlier today during the YouTube Live Presentation. Please be advised that the early dismissal schedule for all schools is as follows:

Early Dismissal Schedule:

- **Friday, May 12, 2023** – The last day of school for graduating seniors will be **Friday, May 12**. Prior to the last day of school, we are advising seniors to meet with their respective counselors to ensure that all requirements have been fulfilled to graduate. *After May 12, seniors should not be on any campus unless they have a scheduled appointment, participating in graduation rehearsal, or a special recognition event.*
- **Monday and Tuesday, May 22-23, 2023** – **Monday and Tuesday, May 22-23**, will serve as early dismissal days for all **high school students only**. **High schools will dismiss at 12:00 p.m.** Elementary and Middle schools will dismiss at their regular times.
- **Wednesday, May 24, 2023 (the last day of the 2022-2023 School Year)** – **Wednesday, May 24**, schools will dismiss on the following schedule: **high schools at 12:00 p.m.; elementary schools will dismiss at 1:15 p.m.; and middle schools will dismiss at 2:15 p.m.**
