# **Social Studies High Impact Strategies**

## **Effectively Utilizing Essential Questions**

- 1. Are students being asked open ended questions that require more than a yes or no answer?
- 2. Are students being asked questions that recurs over time and requires them to make connections between major concepts?
- 3. Are transferrable ideas present in students' responses?
- 4. Do answers require justification from students?

#### S.W.I.R.L.

- 1. Are students speaking in the discipline?
- 2. Are students writing in the discipline?
- 3. Are students illustrating in the discipline?
- 4. Are students reading in the discipline?
- 5. Are students listening in the discipline?

#### **Analyzing and Synthesizing Primary Sources**

- 1. Are students sourcing?
- 2. Are students contextualizing?
- 3. Are students participating in close reading?
- 4. Are students corroborating a variety sources (documents, images, visual & audio media, artifacts)?

#### **Promoting Civil and Civic Discourse**

- 1. Are students debating?
- 2. Are students discussing?
- 3. Are students participating in engagement?

### **Engaging in Historical Thinking**

- 1. Are students examining multiple perspectives?
- 2. Are students providing evidence based claims?
- 3. Are students making connections to current events by recognizing historical patterns and trends?

# Implementing Skills from the Social Studies Skills Matrices

- 1. Information Processing Skills: Are students able to locate, analyze, and synthesize information related to social studies topics and apply this information to solve problems/make decisions?
- 2. Map and Globe Skills: Do students use maps to retrieve social studies information?
