Clayton County Public Schools Launches Pilot Mogul Prep Learning Studios at Two High Schools With PopEd and the Sean Anderson Foundation

JONESBORO – It is Lights, Camera, Action for the Career, Technical, and Agricultural Education (CTAE) Digital Media and Film Magnet Program and Mundy's Mill High and the Audio/Video Film and Technology Pathway at Mount Zion High School. By providing educators and student access to over 100 hours of common core and CTAE aligned curriculum including seven modules and more than 20 lesson plans, the program introduces students to careers in the entertainment industry as a gateway to discover and explore career pathways in any industry.
