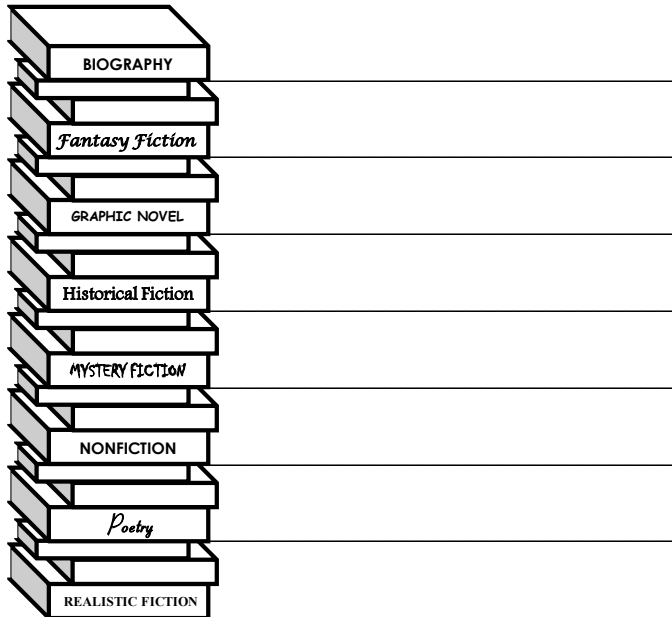
Parents are encouraged to be involved in their children's reading by both helping them make appropriate selections they will enjoy and making reading a daily activity in the home.

Write a review of a book you read this summer.

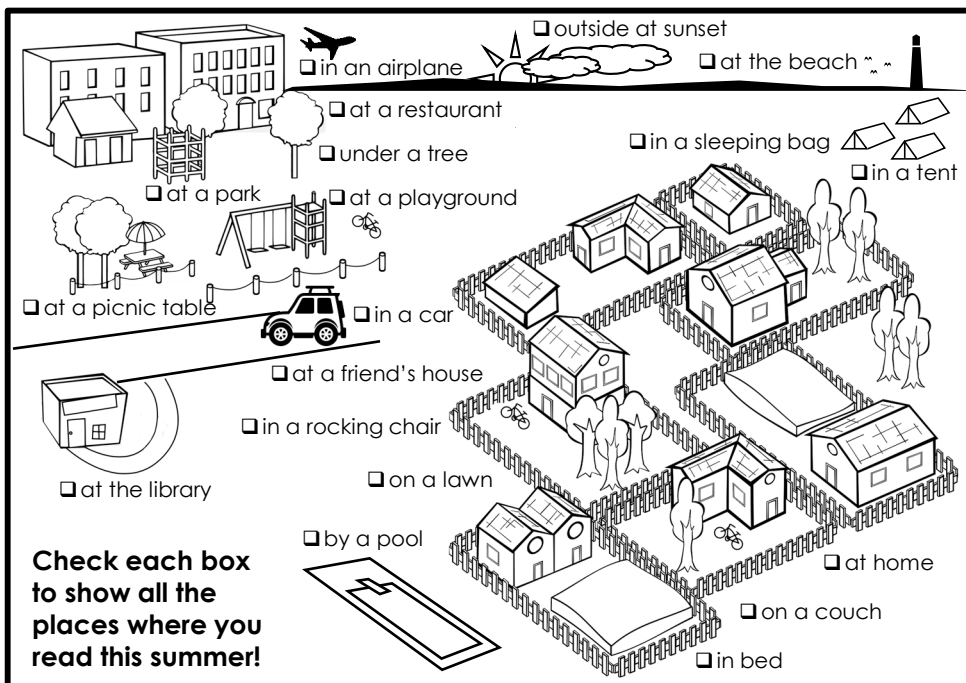
How Long Can You Read?
