CCPS Schools and Offices Will Close for Spring Break April 5-9, 2021

District Alters Meal Services Beginning Monday, April 12

JONESBORO – All schools and offices of Clayton County Public Schools (CCPS) will be closed in observance of Spring Break, April 5-9, 2021. The district’s offices will return to a regular schedule on Monday, April 12, 2021.

Please be reminded that students in grades Pre-K through 5th and 6th grade through 12th-grade low-incident and self-contained special education students will return for hybrid (face-to-face and at home virtual) learning on Monday, April 12, 2021, using an A Day/B Day rotation. Parents who indicated their child(ren) will be returning to school via the parent survey should have received a letter identifying their child(ren) as an A Day or B Day student(s) via the parent portal of Infinite Campus. If not, please contact the school in which your child is enrolled for further information immediately.

All other CCPS students will resume their regular virtual instructional schedules on Monday, April 12, 2021.

CCPS Nutrition Operations as of April 12, 2021

The CCPS School Nutrition Department **will suspend** meal services during the spring break week, April 5 - 9, 2021. Meal service will resume on Monday, April 12, 2021, with Monday, Wednesday, and Friday meals distributed along bus routes.

Also, on April 12, 2021, the new curbside meal pick-up hours are Monday - Friday 7:00 am - 12:00 pm. These meals are open to the community for children 18 years or younger, and up to 21 years of age with special needs. Curbside meals are available for **all** remote learning students.

Students reporting to school for face-to-face learning beginning April 12, 2021, and participating in required testing will receive meals while in school.
