Update on Mt. Zion High School Graduation Ceremony

As shared on May 27, 2021, the Twelve Oaks Stadium live stream experienced some technical issues resulting from the severing of a fiber cable prior to the start of the Mt. Unfortunately, through exhaustive troubleshooting efforts from a variety of district departments and the RCS Production Company, the live stream was not able to be broadcasted for the valued stakeholders of Clayton County Public Schools and Mt. Zion High School. While this issue occurred due to no fault of Clayton County Public Schools or Mt. Zion High School, we are saddened to share that the recorded file of the Mt. Zion High School ceremony was also unretrievable by the RCS Production Company or their subcontracted streaming vendor, Harrison Production Services, LLC and is not available to be shared as previously expected.

"We are extremely disappointed that we were unable to provide the families, friends and loved ones the opportunity to join in the celebration via live stream or through the rebroadcasting of the Mt. Zion High School graduation exercise," said Dr. Morcease J. Beasley, Superintendent/CEO of Schools. "While we certainly understand that unexpected circumstances occur, our students and families deserve the best from all individuals entrusted to work within our school system," he concluded.
