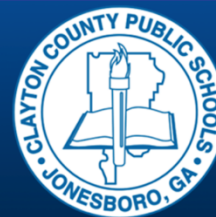

CCPS Prepares for Special Election Day - Tuesday, September 21

JONESBORO – The calendar year of 2021 continues to be impacted by the COVID-19 Coronavirus and its variants, as a portion of Clayton County prepares to visit the polls on Special Election Day, Tuesday, September 21, 2021.

On Special Election Day, registered voters who are represented by the Clayton County Board of Commissioners' First District will cast ballots. On that same day, voters in the Clayton County Board of Education's Eighth District will vote to fill a vacancy on the Board.

Ten candidates will appear on the special election ballot for the Board of Commissioners seat while there will be two names on the ballot for the Board of Education. Eighteen precincts will be open to receive ballots in the county's Special Election on Tuesday, September 21, 2021. Eleven of the 18 polling sites are located on school campuses. CCPS facilities will be used as polling places during the Special Election, which includes the following:

- **Elementary** (*Anderson, East Clayton, Haynie, Huie, McGarrah, Mt. Zion Primary, Mt. Zion, and Smith*);
- **Middle** (*Adamson and Babb*) and *Utopian Academy for the Arts*.

Voters in nine of the 18 precincts will be voting for the Board of Education seat in addition to the Board of Commissioners race. Five of the nine polling sites are located on school campuses. CCPS facilities will be used as polling places during the Special Election for the Board of Education, which includes the following:

- **Elementary** (*Anderson, East Clayton, and Huie*);
- **Middle** (*Adamson*) and *Utopian Academy for the Arts*.

Polls will open at 7 a.m. on Tuesday, September 21 and will close at 7 p.m. All schools involved in this special election are expected to be in session for face-to-face instruction. Voters visiting our campuses are asked to exercise caution while operating vehicles on our campuses to protect the health and safety of all.

A chart containing all precincts that will be open for voters on Tuesday, September 21, can be found below. The precincts with a red asterisk, will have both County Commission District 1 and School Board District 8 on the ballot.
