CCPS Winter Weather Advisory for Thursday, January 4, 2024

JONESBORO - The National Weather Service (NWS) is forecasting temperatures and wind chill levels to fall **below freezing levels** during bus stop hours for Clayton County on **Thursday, January 4, 2024**. It is anticipated that the wind chill temperature could drop to 24 degrees at 6:00 a.m. on Thursday. Temperatures are expected to rise above freezing by mid-morning.

District-level and school-level leadership officials encourage parents/guardians/caregivers and students to prepare for these conditions at bus stops and for walking to school. Students should wear appropriate clothing to protect against the cold.

Special Note: The information expressed here is the most current information related to anticipated weather in the district. It should be understood that weather changes may occur, and as those changes are confirmed by the National Weather Service, they will be reported for any actions deemed appropriate.
